Glick Women's Enrichment Series on April 26, has been named the co-host of the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra's annual holiday Yuletide Celebration sponsored by Duke Energy. Focus Groups Meet as Part of Strategic Plan

Groups included professional women who are civic leaders, individuals involved with culture and tourism in Indianapolis, young professional women, and Prop members who may not be able to respond to an email survey. Sullivan has years of experience with helping local organizations. She has been instrumental in researching and creating marketing solutions to help organizations grow and meet their potential. Sullivan is partnering with Marnie Maxwell to help facilitate a new strategic and marketing plan for the Indianapolis Propylaeum with funding from the Lilly Endowment, Inc.

Research gleaned from the focus groups will be part of the overall strategic and marketing plan that will be completed in early fall 2018. All members are encouraged to participate fully in the survey.

Fun Friday on Tuesday in April Hats Off! To Bes-Ben Hats at the IMA

It is once again time for Newfield's (Indianapolis Museum of Art) Annual Hats Off! Lecture and Lunch. It is difficult to believe that it has been one year since we were at last year's fashion event. This event will be the Propylaeum's Fun Friday for April but will be Tuesday, April 24, 2018. Prop members and friends will be attending this "Hats Off! To Bes-Ben Hats" event. This program is inspired by the exhibition Bes Ben: The Mad Hatter of Chicago.

Our Prop group will be meeting at the Paul Textiles Gallery at 10:30 a.m. for the Bes-Ben Exhibit of more than 60 hats, then walk together to the Deer Zink Special Events Pavilion to our Propylaeum table(s) for the lecture and lunch. At 11:00 a.m., Abigail Aldridge, Milliner, New York City, will be presenting the approximately one-hour long lecture. Ms. Aldridge has been designing and making hats since 1989. The delicious luncheon will be served at noon. This is a fund-raising event for the Museum's Fashion Arts Society to fund new acquisitions.

According to several websites, Benjamin B. Green-Field is the creative genius behind the much-admired Bes-Ben hat label. He designed hats using a variety of everyday objects and unusual trimmings, like fake cigarettes, stuffed animals, plastic fruits and vegetables, and bejeweled objects. Benjamin B. Green-Field was born in Chicago in 1898. Mr. Green-Field and his sister (she was the "Bes" and he was the "Ben") opened their first hat Boutique on Chicago's State Street in 1920, eventually expanding to four more locations in the area. The hats were lovely, but in the 1940's, the label embarked on a much more creative course. The designs became unusual, whimsical, and even outrageous. Benjamin embraced nontraditional material during the rationing World War II years, embracing materials like kitchen utensils and napkin rings. He made a hat for Hedda Hopper, who was known to wear unusual hats, to wear to the premiere of the movie "The Razor's Edge". This hat was topped with real razor blades! Celebrities Elizabeth Taylor and Judy Garland wore Bes-Ben hats. These hats were very expensive with prices ranging from \$37 to \$1000, at a time when Sears was selling hats for \$2.00. Vintage Bes-Ben hats are still sought after today by modern day hat aficionados, due to their unusual designs and collectible status. After enjoying success as a Milliner, Mr.

Green-Field became a passionate philanthropist and in 1987, endowed the Benjamin B. Green-Field Foundation to improve the quality of life for children and seniors in his hometown of Chicago.
